In every conference, we assume that half of our time will be wasted: brilliant scientists talking too low, or too fast, reading their text-filled slides, showing graphs that no-one else can understand and trying to fill-up our brains with every single detail of their research progress. Too much information. Half of our precious time lost in "PIC". This must change, and it is in our hands!
